Dear AHF Families,

We begin November celebrating All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. These are two important feasts of our faith, when we honor all of the saints who serve as an example of faith in action, and we also honor the faithful departed in our lives. We end the month with Thanksgiving and the Solemnity of Christ the King.

Thanksgiving has great significance in the US. This is the one secular holiday we have where the focus is on thanking God for all he has given us. Often times, we are quick to pray to God for what we need, and don't always remember to thank Him for all He has given us.

Pope Francis, in a homily given in 2018, explained the importance of giving thanks. He said, "If we can realize that everything is God's gift, how happy will our hearts be! Everything is His gift. He is our strength!" He went on to tell the crowd, "Saying 'thank you' is such an easy thing and yet so hard." His homily continued, "How often do we say 'thank you' to one another in our families? These are essential words for our life in common...If families can say these three things, they will be fine: 'sorry', 'excuse me', 'thank you.' How often do we say 'thank you' in our families? How often do we say 'thank you' to those who help us, those close to us, those at our side throughout life? All too often we take everything for granted." He went on to say that Mary's words at the Annunciation, ('My soul magnifies the Lord'), are "a song of praise and thanksgiving to God, not only for what He did for Her, but for what He had done throughout the history of salvation."

To magnify means to make greater or bigger. What he was referring to is that Our Lady teaches us to open our eyes to God. He is not distant or far away. He is very close to each and every one of us and is alive and well in our lives. What an important thing for us to be thankful for!

Please take the time to read our very busy calendar. Our Drama Club has been working hard since the beginning of school on the upcoming play *The Phantom of the Opera*. Show times are Friday, November 3 at 10am and 7pm and Saturday November 4 at 3pm. We are excited about basketball starting this month. ## **Thanksgiving and Christmas Break Travel Protocol**


Thanksgiving break takes place from Wed. Nov. 22-Sun. Nov 26. The dorms will be open. Please notify Sr. Rafael (<u>smraf@ahfbaltic.org</u>) no later than Saturday, November 11 if your daughter will be staying in the dorm or travelling home or at a friend's house. If travelling, students must return by 9 pm Sunday, Nov. 26.

Christmas break will be upon us sooner than later. It is best to make preparations from now, as our dorms are closed annually during the Christmas break. Students who are not travelling home are encouraged to visit sponsors in the US or plan on accompanying a friend from school to spend the vacation with her family. It is imperative that all travel arrangements be emailed to Sr. Rafael (<u>smraf@ahfbaltic.org</u>). Open communication is essential to ensure the correct travel arrangements.

Please note the following:

- Midterm exams will not be administered earlier than the scheduled dates. Please do not ask to have them earlier, as per the handbook.
- Due to midterm exams, the soonest students may leave would be Tuesday, Dec. 18 at 10:15 if they have no exam during F period. Otherwise, they will be able to leave at 11:45am
- The dorms re-open on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. Classes start on January 3.
- We provide transportation only to Framingham, not Logan International Airport in Boston. If you book for Logan, the students will need to board the Logan Express bus for Framingham. We pick up directly only on January 2nd at TF GREEN International Airport in Providence (Warwick) RI and Bradley International Airport in Windsor Locks (Hartford) CT. If the students are arriving on a day other than the 2<sup>nd</sup>, please arrange alternate transportation, such as an Uber or taxi.
