Dear AHF Families,

Advent is upon us. It is a time of great anticipation of the coming of Our Savior, Jesus. We hear a lot from the prophet Isaiah in our readings during this season. Isaiah is the most quoted prophet in the New Testament, and his Book is second only to Psalms in the number of quotations from Scripture in the New Testament. He was troubled by the moral breakdown of his time. His message is as relevant today as it was many centuries ago. He played an important role in God's plan. He foretold the coming of the Messiah and brought hope to his people during challenging times. The promise of hope is for all of us. He shows how God works for the good of all of us, His children, and is with us even in the worst of circumstances. He has promised salvation for us through Jesus, who frees us from our sins. In Him, we have hope for eternity.

In a very special way, one could consider the clergy, and religious Sisters and Brothers (in our case, especially the Sisters of Charity of Our Lady, Mother of the Church), our modern day "Isaiahs". They instill in us (all of us- students and adults) by their very demeanor the importance of listening to God very carefully, especially at Mass, and the proper reverence and respect for the Eucharist. Think about how blessed we are to be able to have our students attend Mass and receive the Eucharist as part of our normal school schedules! The earlier we instill our Christian values in our young people, the more chance we have of Isaiah's message to be met with open ears and open hearts, which will last a lifetime.

Take comfort in the fact that AHF is the counter culture when it comes to what this holy Season of Advent is all about. It is NOT about buying presents and rushing around in consumer madness. Every year, there seems to be more and more commercialism and secularization of this Holy Season. Department stores have their Christmas displays of goods before Halloween, and it is rare to find any spiritual value in what is displayed.

We are blessed to be in the ministry of Catholic education at AHF. We prioritize the Gospel message of Jesus Christ our Savior. Not only do our students recognize this priority and want to learn more about it, but they also live it each and every day. That, my friends, is worth more than any material gift they could receive for Christmas.

My prayer for you this month is that we all heed Isaiah's message of how to live, keep Jesus in the center of the Advent and Christmas Seasons, and that we all become beacons of His Light.

Have a wonderful peace-filled Advent and Christmas Season.

### IMPORTANT REMINDERS REGARDING TRANSPORTATION DURING CHRISTMAS BREAK

- ➤ Dorms are closed annually during the Christmas break. Students who are not travelling home are encouraged to visit sponsors in the US or plan on accompanying a friend from school to spend the vacation with her family. It is imperative that all travel arrangements be emailed to Sr. Rafael (smraf@ahfbaltic.org)
- > If a student does stay with a friend over the vacation, permission slips must be signed by both the parent/guardian of the student visiting and the parent/guardian hosting. The school does not arrange for students to go to other students' houses. These arrangements are organized by students and their families.
- ➤ Due to midterm exams, the soonest students may leave would be Monday, December 18 is at 10:15 am if they have no exam during F period. Otherwise, they will be able to leave at 11:45. If travel arrangements have already been made by families for the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, the school will honor that.
- ➤ Dorms re-open on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. Classes resume January 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- ➤ We provide transportation directly from TF Green International Airport in Providence (Warwick), RI, and Bradley International Airport in Windsor Locks (Hartford), CT. For flights arriving in Logan International Airport in Boston, the students will need to board the Logan Express bus for Framingham, MA. We only provide transportation from Framingham, not Logan airport. If the students are arriving on a day other than the 2<sup>nd</sup>, please arrange alternate transportation, such as Uber or taxi.


Make-up period will be after school on any day by appointment with the class teacher. NO exams may be taken ahead of the scheduled exam period without the permission of the school principal.
