ADVANCED PLACEMENT CLASSES AND EXAMS

The Academy of the Holy Family offers AP classes in Pre-Calculus, Calculus, AB and BC, and Coding. In addition, through the offerings at the Catholic Virtual High School (CVHS), the Academy is able to offer many additional AP classes that would otherwise not be available to the students. All students who take an AP class, either through the school or with the CVHS, are expected to sit for the AP exams. Dual Enrollment classes are offered to all Juniors and Seniors who maintain a 3.50 or higher GPA at Three Rivers Community College Partnership Program.
