Sara Majewski, class of 2015 who is a CPA and Senior Accountant at Ascension.



Travel Arrangements For Easter Break

Easter break runs from April 16-27. Please begin travel arrangements early. We provide transportation directly to TF Green International Airport in Providence (Warwick), RI, and Bradley International Airport in Windsor Locks (Hartford), CT. For flights departing from Logan International Airport in Boston, the students will need to board the Logan Express bus for Framingham, MA. We only provide transportation to Framingham, not Logan airport. Please note: all residents must arrive no later than Sunday, April 27 and classes resume Monday, April 28.
