Christmas Break Travel Protocol

Christmas break will be upon us soon. It is imperative that all travel arrangements be emailed to Sr. Rafael (smraf@ahfbaltic.org) no later than December 15. It is best to make preparations from now, as our dorms are closed annually during the Christmas break. Students who are not travelling home are encouraged to visit sponsors in the US or plan on accompanying a friend from school to spend the vacation with her family. Open communication is essential to ensure the correct travel arrangements. Thank you to those of you who have already sent travel information.

Please note the following:

- Due to midterm exams, the soonest students may leave would be Thursday, Dec. 18 at 10:15 if they have no exam during F period. Otherwise, they will be able to leave at 11:45am
- The dorms re-open no earlier than January 4th. Classes start on January 5th.
- We provide transportation both ways to Logan International Airport in Boston, TF GREEN International Airport in Providence (Warwick) RI and Bradley International Airport in Windsor Locks (Hartford) CT. If the students are arriving on a day other than January 4, please arrange alternate transportation, such as an Uber or taxi.
